



Code of Conduct

Information to make archery safe and enjoyable for all participants

1. Only shoot at the targets provided.
2. Members are allowed to practice at the Club any most days during daylight.
3. Wear your membership cards on quivers when on the Ranges and present them when asked.
4. No Broadheads or Hunting allowed on the Ranges. (some special club days excluded)
5. Please refrain from using Outserts on arrows as they damage our Bails and 3D targets.
6. For safety reasons, when shooting or practicing on Ranges, do not reverse or short cut course lanes.
7. Do not bring newbies on the Range to shoot without them being endorsed by the club instructor.
8. Do not give out any codes or membership information to non-members.
9. Report all incidents, infringements, or safety hazards to one of the committee members.
10. Please leave or replace all target faces on butts where possible for other members.
1. Check the Website or Teamapp regularly for all shoot day changes and notices. (Codes obtained from the Membership officer)
11. Shooting starts at 08:30; registration is from 07:30 to 08:00 for Group allocations and equipment checks.
12. Members require a Minimum of 2 MATCHED sets of 3 arrows marked 1, 2, and 3.
13. Security cameras are in place at certain times and areas.
14. On shoot days for safety reasons, please no archery equipment to be worn in the clubhouse.
15. Wear appropriate clothing and hats, covered in shoes is Mandatory.
16. For safety reasons, please walk on the mowed pathways/tracked between targets.
17. Mobile Phones are to be set to Silent or Airplane Mode.
18. Smoking in designated area only. Smoking is not permitted on any range.
19. Non-Members (including Family Members) are NOT permitted to shoot with a Coach present on the Range.

Basic archery etiquette.

Do NOT:

1. Talk in a loud voice whilst others are shooting.
2. Talk to another archer who prefers to be silent.
3. Offer advice unless asked.
4. Using a mobile phone other than taking photos.
5. Exclaim on the shooting line, for yourself or others, in joy or disgust.
6. Walk off the shooting line while your neighbour is at full draw.
7. Touch another archer's equipment without their permission.
8. Walk up and down the line comparing scores.
9. Shoot distances beyond their capability, continually missing and holding up shooting.
10. Disturb people with loud mobile phone ring tones or speaking on the phone on or around the shooting line.
11. Smoke near the shooting or waiting line.
12. Leave litter on the archery ground.
